Greatest Commandment

- Matthew 22:37-39
 - He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'"

The 10 Commandments

- 1. I am the LORD your God. You shall worship the Lord your God and Him only shall you serve.
- 2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.
- 3. Remember to keep holy the Lord's day.
- 4. Honor your father and your mother.
- 5. You shall not kill.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

The 10 Commandments

- First 3 honor God
- The rest honor humanity

Precepts of the Church

- Assist at Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation
- Confess once per liturgical year
- Receive communion at least during Easter Season
- Observe prescribe days of fasting and abstinence
- Observe Marriage laws
- Missionary Spirit
- Assist the Church according to your means

Holy Days - In U.S.

- Mary, Mother of God January 1
- Ascension of our Lord
- Assumption of Mary August 15
- All Saints Day November 1
- Immaculate Conception of Mary December 8
- Nativity of Our Lady December 25

Fasting and Abstinence

- Penance
- Abstinence Do not eat meat
 - Fridays Especially during Lent
 - Ash Wednesday
 - Good Friday
 - After 14
- Fasting Only one full meal
 - After 18 until 59 During Lent

Confession

- Mortal and Venial Sins
- Sacrament of Healing
- Once per Liturgical Year
- Maintain a "State of Grace" to receive Eucharist
- Sealed
- Involves
 - Confession, Penance, Act of Contrition, Absolution

Communion

- Must be in a "state of grace"
- Fast one hour prior
 - May be waived for health issues
- Receiving
 - Profound Bow or Genuflect (Diocesan Request)
 - Priest, "Body of Christ..." You, "Amen"
 - On tongue or in hand, but must be consumed
 - Sign of the Cross
 - If dropped minister must consume

Beatitudes Matthew 5:3-10

- Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven
- Blessed are they who mourn, for they shall be comforted
- Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth
- Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied
- Blessed are the merciful, for they obtain mercy

Beatitudes

- Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God
- Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God
- Blessed are they who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven
- Blessed are you when men revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account

Corporal Works of Mercy

- 1. Feed the hungry
- 2. Give drink to the thirsty
- 3. Clothe the naked
- 4. Visit the imprisoned
- 5. Shelter the homeless
- 6. Visit the sick
- 7. Bury the dead

Spiritual Works of Mercy

- 1. Admonish the sinner
- 2. Instruct the ignorant
- 3. Counsel the doubtful
- 4. Comfort the sorrowful
- 5. Bear wrongs patiently
- 6. Forgive all injuries
- 7. Pray for the living and the dead

Liturgical Seasons A,B & C

- 1. Advent Sunday Closet to November 30
- 2. Christmas Christmas to Baptism of the Lord
- 3. Ordinary Time
- 4. Lent 40 days (Ash Wednesday, Holy Week & Triduum)
- 5. Easter Easter Sunday to Pentecost (50 days)
- 6. Ordinary Time II
